Specialists' Services

YNHS has available the services of a podiatrist to examine and treat foot problems of men, women, and children. Also, an audiologist is available for free hearing screening and hearing aid testing.

Fees

The patient fee schedule at Yakima Neighborhood Health Services is designed to provide affordable health care to families. Fees are charged on a sliding fee scale, depending on the family's size and income level. Patients are encouraged to pay any charges at the time of service. YNHS also welcomes bartering arrangements for those patients who would like to provide certain services for the clinic. Please ask the receptionist for more information.

Immunizations

Immunizations are provided during Immunization Clinics held EVERY THIRD FRIDAY AT YNHS FROM 1:00pm-4:30pm. The charge is \$2.00 per immunization.

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SERVICES AVAILABLE

Primary Health Care

Physicians and other licensed health care professionals are available five days a week for primary and preventive health care to men, women, and children.

Night Clinics

During summer and fall, clinic hours are extended to meet the needs of those working. The clinic is open until 8:00pm with a physician available for medical care.

Women, Infants, & Children (WIC) Nutrition Program

The WIC program is a supplemental food and nutrition education program. Participants are seen by appointment to establish eligibility. The program is available to pregnant women and breastfeeding women, and infants and children up to the age of five. All participants must show nutritional risk to qualify for the WIC program. Dietitians, nutritionists, and nutrition assistants are available for nutritional counseling and assessment. (In Sunnyside, call 837-8200 for an appointment.*)

Social Services

A Social Service staff is available to make home visits, assist YNHS patients in entering other service programs in Yakima, provide transportation, assist with language problems when the patient seeks services outside the clinic, and generally act as advocates to YNHS clientele.

Obstetrical Outreach Services

Prenatal intake and referral to community physicians for full obstetrical care and delivery. Transportation and interpreters from YNHS are available for patients requesting assistance.

Nutritional Counseling

YNHS has a full time Registered Dietitian to provide nutritional counseling to all patients who have a need in this area. The dietitian sees patients by appointment only.
