



## YNHS 1985 ACTIVITY REPORT

### Women, Infants and Children(WIC)Nutrition Program

The WIC program is a supplemental food and nutrition education program. Participants are evaluated to establish eligibility (determined by income level and medical/nutritional deficiencies). The program is available to pregnant women, infants, and children up to the age of five. Clients are seen by dietitians, nutritionists and nutrition assistants.

### Primary and Preventive Health Care

Physicians and other health care professionals treat patients for chronic and acute conditions. Fees are based on a sliding fee scale, depending on the family's income and size. Last year, 96% of the patients seen at YNHS who were without third-party coverage were from families whose income was below the federal poverty level.

### Outreach / Social Service Intervention

The YNHS Social Service staff is available to make home visits, provide transportation and/or interpreting services to physicians' offices in the community. Special emphasis is on assisting YNHS prenatal clients through their prenatal and newborn care.
