



In the first 2 months of the project, we enrolled 1000 children; made 225 calls to parents, 75 were non-English speaking; sent 48 letters; and retrieved 150 immunization records. Only 3% of the records were up to date. We are awaiting the results of the calls to parents of 2 month olds to remind them of the first infant immunizations. Our goal is to have 90% of 2 year olds fully immunized by the year 2000.


