1. PHILOSOPHY OF THE COMMUNITY NURSING CENTER

Prevention of illness, promotion and maintenance of health, along with the restoration of health deficits will be the major focus of nursing services provided by the Delaware Nursing Centers, Inc. Nursing services provided will be based on the following concepts:

a. A HEALTH/WELLNESS CONTINUUM: Absolute health is unattainable; health as a state must be considered in a relative sense. Attention will be focused on normal structure and function, rather than abnormal. The goal will be to identify health assets and deficits; to preserve assets and to convert health deficits to assets whenever possible. (8) Wellness is defined as that state of harmony between body, mind, emotions, and spirit in an ever-changing environment.

b. HOLISM: A belief in the inter-relationship of the individual and her/his environment, consisting of one's self (internal environment) and one's family, friends, community, and world (external environment). The total individual and their family is involved in an effort to maximize her/his potential for health.

c. THE SELF-CARE CONCEPT encourages participation of the individual and acceptance of responsibility for her or his own health care. This concept includes respect for the dignity and personhood of the individual, her/his needs, wants, preferences, and right of self-determination.

d. INDEPENDENCE of the individual will be encouraged, rather than dependence. Client advocacy will be practiced with caution to avoid encouraging passivity, and to encourage active participation in one's own health care and planning.

2. GOALS OF THE COMMUNITY NURSING CENTER

a. CLIENT-CENTERED GOALS

(1) To provide community-based primary health care services that are of high quality, convenient, affordable, and that meet the health care needs of the people living in the community.

(2) To assist individuals to attain and maintain their optimum level of health congruent with their age, present level of health and development, personal life goals, personal and community resources, culture and life-style.

(3) To act as coordinators to accomplish continuity of care as the individual moves through the health care system.

(4) To act as client advocates to help the individual to choose and use the health care resources available in the larger community to her or his benefit.

(5) To promote self-responsibility for personal health care.

(6) To develop an outreach program to identify the health needs of people in the community.

(7) To provide accessible community health education programs.

b. PROFESSIONAL NURSING GOALS

(1) To provide a site for cross-cultural nursing education in cooperation with nursing educational facilities.

(2) To promote professional nursing as a career choice for Hispanics and other ethnic groups.

(3) To provide a site for nursing research.

(4) To support the independent, autonomous, responsible practice of registered nurses.
