anything is left, it goes to the government to offset Rosa's salary.

That salary is a modest (for a physician) \$18,000 to \$21,000 a year.

"I knew the salary before, but it is really a good program," Rosa said.

He is obligated to the federal government for two years because of a medical school scholarship he received.

"This is not a government handout," says Imboden.

"It is one of the few programs where they (government officials) are in it to help us get started and then get out as soon as possible."
