Africans visit Beaufort area

A small group from Operation Crossroads Africa, Inc., an educational and cultural exchange program of the Department of State to provide opportunities for Africans to visit the United States for firsthand contact with various facets of American life, visited the Lowcountry recently as guests of Beaufort-Jasper Comprehensive Health Services, Inc. (B-JCHS, Inc.)

Dr. Ahmed Abdel Halim, Dr. Kweku Ward-Brew and Mrs. Theresa Mansary, R.N. received an in-depth look into B-JCHS, Inc. program in an effort to study its management, organization, service delivery concept and impact. Most of the concerns expressed by the group include the African problem of developing a system of stable and sustained rural medical care and the need to further develop preventive programs, especially in the area of maternal and infant care. They were most interested in the satellite clinic and central facility concept.

Along with their State Department escort, William Fager, the group looked at such local projects as Levy-Limehouse-Bellinger Hill Water Co., Beaufort Memorial Hospital, the Department of Health and Environmental Control, St. Mary Human Development Center, Title VII Senior Citizen sites as well as the B-JCHS, Inc. service area

Dr. Ahmed, a Community Physician and Deputy Assistant Commissioner for health in Sudan was most impressed with the integration of social and healthservices and the team work concept. The Deputy Director of Medical Services/Regional Medical Officer of Health in Ghana, Dr. Ward-Brew hopes to adapt concepts of the Senior Citizens Nutrition Program. "This is the first program of its kind I've seen in the world and I hope to begin something similar when I go home," he said. Mrs. Mansary, a supervisor in a rural health clinic in Sierra Leone, is planning to consolidate some concepts of maternal child care and nutrition to use in her country because of widespread malnutrition about six months of every year.

The entire group agreed that the site visit was most beneficial and hope that persons from this area can at some time visit their countries. Thomas C. Barnwell, Jr., Executive Director of B-JCHS, Inc. related that the program was honored in having the opportunity to host this site visit and is pleased that the agency was chosen.
