## First Annual 5K In Meriden A Great Success

On the morning of Saturday, May 11th, hundreds got together at Hubbard Park in Meriden, Connecticut to exercise for a great cause. The event - titled the CHC Meriden 5k: Race for Mental Health - was presented by the Community Health Center, Inc. and sponsored by nine local <u>business</u> 🗹 and organizations including lead sponsor Anthem Blue Cross and Blue Shield. Those in attendance persevered through inclement weather, with just under 150 finishers between the 5k run, Health Walk, and Superhero-themed Kids Fun Run. Over \$5,000 was raised to improve mental health care in Connecticut. According to the National Institute of Mental Health (NIMH), about 1 in every 4 adults (26%) suffers from a diagnosable mental disorder in a given year. This number - which is estimated at 58 million people aged eighteen and older - makes mental disorders the number one type of disability in the United States.
