Open Door Family Medical Centers Receives Grant from Sole Ryeders & Friends

Open Door Family Medical Centers has received a \$20,000 grant from Sole Ryeders & Friends, a volunteer organization based in Westchester County that supports health and wellness through a number of outreach programs. The grant to Open Door is the result of fundraising efforts of the Sole Ryeders' team who participated in the 39 mile Avon Walk for Breast Cancer. The money will support Open Door's Breast Health, Education, Outreach and Case Management Program, specifically the Patient Advocates who are an integral part of the program.

Open Door's <u>Breast Health Education</u>, <u>Outreach and Case Management Program</u> encompasses culturally and linguistically appropriate support services that facilitate access to education, screening, diagnosis, and treatment for low-income, uninsured or underinsured, women of Westchester County who call Open Door their Medical Home.

Through the Breast Health Education, Outreach and Case Management Program in 2011-2012, Open Door hopes to serve 6,000 women ages 21 to 65 with outreach, education and annual clinical breast exams, and 3,000 women over age 40 with outreach, education, clinical breast exams and patient assistance services for mammograms. The grant money from the Sole Ryeders will support Patient Advocates at Open Door's four Westchester County sites. Patient Advocates help patients work with doctors, case managers, insurance companies, and others who have an effect on the patients' health. Open Door's Patient Advocate Program has become a national model for care as health centers around the country have asked for assistance in replicating their program.

Founded in 2007, Sole Ryeders & Friends is a volunteer-driven organization based in Westchester County, New York which supports health and wellness by:

- Fundraising and awarding grants through partnerships with local cancer-related, health and wellness programs;
