OPEN DOOR RECOGNIZES FIFTEEN PORT CHESTER TEENS AT FUTURE HEALTH LEADERS GRADUATION CEREMONY

Fifteen Port Chester High School students will be joined by Open Door Family Medical Centers and the 21st Visions Program from Port Chester High School (www.opendoormedical.org), family, friends and community partners on Thursday, July 29 to celebrate their completion of the **Future Health Leaders Program**. The four-week summer intensive, developed by Open Door in partnership with Port Chester High School, introduced students to a broad range of health care providers and health topics through on-site visits at Open Door, local hospitals and other health care facilities. As part of the ceremony on Thursday the students, who were selectively chosen based on teacher recommendations and personal motivation, will each present an outline of the healthcare career they wish to pursue.

Through this innovative program the young **Future Healthcare Leaders** have become well-versed in a variety of health-related topics including basic medical training, nutrition, exercise, adolescent medicine and mental health. The students were also certified in Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR), taught how to take vital signs and provide first aid medical care. The students demonstrated their understanding of what they had learned by presenting a summer safety skills class to second graders. In addition they were able to exercise their newly developed professional skills through mock job interviews with health professionals.

"We are very proud of these students and we are so happy we were able to give them this opportunity. Our students have a unique chance to see first hand such a comprehensive overview of the health careers. They visit health centers and meet with health professionals at every level, gaining insight about medical careers that they don't receive anywhere else," said Ellette Hirschorn, RN, Director of Clinical Services and Programs at Open Door. "They are now peer leaders and mentors to their fellow students because of this program, which opens doors to career paths they would not have considered otherwise."
