Throughout the day, Open Door health professionals will provide education and screenings on a variety of health topics including body mass index (BMI), blood pressure, HIV, podiatry, optometry, and reproductive health. Purdy Avenue will be closed for the duration of the event allowing for outdoor physical activities including yoga, Zumba, Tai Chi, and boxing. Children can enjoy healthy activities for the body and mind including a Bouncy Castle, arts and crafts tables, a reading corner, and outdoor games. Alongside local food, fashion, and jewelry vendors, community friends of Open Door including the Village of Port Chester, Council of Community Services/Port Chester Cares Community Coalition, the Carver Center, Hudson Health Plan, Greenwich Hospital, and White Plains Hospital will offer educational information about preventive health care, health literacy and nutrition for the entire family.
