Open Door Family Medical Centers welcomed Ossining Mayor William Hanauer the morning of Monday, May 10, where he proclaimed May 9-15, the week following Mother's Day as **Ossining Women's Health Week**. Mayor Hanauer, who considers Open Door a "hub of activities" in Ossining, stressed the importance of women's health in the community saying "if we don't have healthy women, we don't have healthy children."

This year's theme, "It's Your Time," aims to empower women to prioritize their personal wellbeing. Women's Health Week coincides with National AmeriCorps week (www.americorpsweek.gov). Open Door's AmeriCorps volunteers, the driving force of the week's events, were on-hand with educational materials and information on a variety of women's health topics in English and Spanish. "The idea to celebrate Women's Health Week came from our AmeriCorps members," says Martina Persson, AmeriCorps Program Administrator at Open Door. "We are grateful for them and could not put on events like these without them."
