## WE ARE ONEWORLD

Community health centers provide primary care and support services to over 22 million patients nationwide, primarily low income, minority, Medicaid or uninsured individuals. Providing a comprehensive approach to health care, geared to overcome the effects of poverty and remove the barriers to access to



quality health care for vulnerable populations, health centers promote the health and economic vitality of communities.

Care is holistic and provided in partnership with patients and the community. As "health care homes," health centers offer medical, dental, behavioral health, pharmacy and other services.

Health Centers accept most insurance plans, including Medicare, Medicaid and insurance. For patients with limited incomes and who do not have health insurance, a sliding fee scale is offered, based on family size and income.

OneWorld has a rich forty-two year history beginning as a volunteer grassroots clinic growing and expanding services every year. In 2012 the health center celebrates a decade as a federally qualified and Joint Commission accredited health center. OneWorld's Board of Directors is visionary, rooted in mission, and is comprised of 17-members with a patient majority, that ensures the health center is responsive to the most pressing local needs.


Walk-in evening volunteer dental clinic that expanded with volunteer medical providers at 1901 Castelar. Incorporated as a non-profit corporation.

### LUIS'S STORY

Daniela had a growth on one of her eyes, which was painful and made it difficult for her to see. She was scheduled for an eye operation, which was to be covered by Medicaid. Although Luis had renewed on time a few weeks before the surgery was scheduled. Luis received a letter stating her case would be closed due to the family's income prior to the scheduled surgery.

After looking at the family's case, OneWorld staff discovered that this family was denied



Medicaid in error, as their income was below the maximum guidelines. After close follow-up and advocacy, the family's DHHS caseworker was able to process Daniela's Medicaid case just three days before the surgery was scheduled. The hospital was alerted that the child had coverage and the surgery was able to go on without delay. The child is no longer in pain and she is now able to see.







## 2011 ACCOMPLISHMENTS



Over the past five years the number of patients that call OneWorld their health care home has grown by 11,758 people, now totaling 23,000.

Our shovels hit the ground in January 2012, beginning the construction of two new buildings adjacent to the Livestock Exchange Building that will transform

our health center into an affordable housing and primary care campus and enable us to be the health care home to an additional 12,000 underserved patients over the next five years.

An incredible first year of operation was completed at Indian Hill, Spring Lake and Liberty Elementary School-Based Health Centers in partnership with Building Bright Futures and Omaha Public Schools; bringing health care to children that would otherwise go without care.

One World initiated of a new adult substance abuse outpatient treatment and counseling program for adults with the partnership of Region 6 Behavioral Health Care, bringing recovery and new hope for our patients.

Our prenatal care program welcomed an additional 200 patients growing from 952 to 1,171; resulting in the birth of 634 children by skilled physicians and nurse midwives. Our midwifery program became the largest program in the State of Nebraska.

A team of skilled outreach and enrollment specialists ensured that 6,000 children were enrolled, or maintained their status as participants, in Kids Connection, or Medicaid.

Moved into our current location in the Historic Livestock Exchange Building.

Partnered with the Ronald McDonald House Charities for the Caremobile, mobile dental clinic. Opened our second clinical location, Cass Family Medicine, in Plattsmouth, Nebraska.

Our dental team expanded efforts at oral health promotion and disease prevention in partnership with the State of Nebraska, providing exams and fluoride application to our WIC program participants and students at several South Omaha elementary schools. Expansion for this planned program is for Sarpy County in partnership with the Midlands Community Foundation.

OneWorld led a Health Information Technology transformation to improve the quality of care through our partner corporation; Heartland Community Health Network ensuring that five community health centers share an Electronic Health Record; Charles Drew Health Center-Omaha, Council Bluffs Community Health Center-Council Bluffs Iowa; OneWorld Community Health Center-Omaha; People's Health Center-Lincoln; Norfolk Community Health Clinic-Norfolk.



Long known for "growing our own," we designed and piloted our first OneWorld Leadership Academy that will have long lasting impact on the health centers' ability to provide quality care.

We joined the "PCMH buzz" in primary care through submission of an application to be certified as a Patient Centered Medical Home; Level 3.

"The Friends of OneWorld", a new Network of Support for OneWorld was launched with the exceptional leadership of Meredith Weitz and Alanna Schenken.

Opened three School-Based Health Centers in South Omaha and assumed operation of Pharmacy. January 5, 2012 Broke ground on new facilities.
