### La Maestra's Microcredit Program for Women

It's around 5 o'clock on Monday, women trickle into a meeting room. A woman named Martha shows up with a big rolling cart, announcing that she has brought chicken mole and rice. Soon follows Rosa, with a giant bowl of chilled chopped fruit and a pitcher of refreshing agua de jamaica. Judging by the lively conversations and enticing smells of homemade food, a passerby might think these women are here for some kind of party.

This gathering is one of the weekly meetings of La Maestra's Microcredit Program for women. La Maestra is among the first organizations in San Diego, and the United States, to establish a microcredit program for women. Through this program, low income women in City Heights, Chula Vista, National City, Logan Heights and El Cajon receive loans of \$250, \$500, \$1000. The program provides impoverished women, who would otherwise depend on government assistance, with the opportunity to be independent and empowered to better their own lives and eventually operate sustainable businesses employing others.

Potential new borrowers must be recommended by a program participant

who has been successful in repaying a \$1000 loan and been in the program for at least 18 months. In order to receive the initial \$250 loan, the new borrower cannot own property. Before receiving a loan, the borrower must complete financial literacy training and develop a business plan, attend three meetings, and be approved by the other borrowers in the group. Through this program, each woman finds that she has the power to obtain and pay back a loan, the discipline to attend weekly meetings and save money for future investments, and the skills to operate a business and generate an income. The group holds each individual borrower responsible. This group consensus system, combined with the fact that women meet, support and grow with each other on a weekly basis, creates a strong sense of responsibility, ultimately resulting in the highly successful repayment rate.

Since March 2008, the number of participants in the microcredit program has increased from 30 to more than 230, with a 98% repayment rate. More than 300 women are waiting to participate in the program.
