Former Bangor City Manager Royce Downey dies in Kentucky

MARION, Ky. — Funeral services were held Sunday for former Bangor City Manager Royce Downey, who died Thursday night of an apparent heart attack moments after accepting an award from the Marion Chamber of Commerce.

Downey, 60, served as Bangor city manager from 1979 to 1986, when he resigned after being indicted by a federal grand jury on charges of misusing a federal grant acquitted by a U.S. District Court

Downey was subsequently acquitted of the charges.

For the past year he had been ry city manager of Marion, a western Kentucky community of about 4,000

Downey died during a dinner Thursday night where the Marion-Crittenden County Chamber hon-ored him for his efforts in attracting five industries to the area.
