Fees will be charged patients on a sliding scale, based on the patient's ability to pay. Ms. Ryder said that appointments must be made, to make the best use of Dr. Robert Clark, the physician for the clinic. Hours will be from 8:30 to 5 p.m. and the phone number is 925-0078. With recent cut backs in medicaid, the clinic offers city and area residents affordable and accessible health care. Ms. Ryder said the staff will also be doint "health fair kind of things" — health education, community health activities. Costs can be kept to a minimum of \$22 to \$24 per visit as compared to the average \$50 to \$100 charge of a hospital emergency room because of the reduced overhead, she noted.
